Guidelines for a Virtual/Audio Meeting

In this time of the Coronavirus with social distancing and stay at home rules, we are thinking of how we can connect and run the business of our groups. Some organizations are using the virtual/audio meeting in place of the face-to-face ones. You may wish to conduct a virtual/audio meeting especially with your Officers. This is not the ideal way as it can be hard to get right, but it is an option you can consider. Here are a few things that may help you have a more productive and successful virtual/audio meeting.

While the basics for your meeting remain the same, your participation requires a different approach.

1. Choose the Right Technology

There are several virtual meeting platforms from which to choose. Some of these are free, others charge a fee.

Skype: This offers basic online group phone and video calls. This works for short and limited attendance meetings.

Citrix GoToMeeting: Users can share screens and it works with tablets, smart phones or other mobile devices.

Cisco WebEx: This offers video and participants can work together during the meeting.

Conference Call: Offers only audio for participants.

Video conferencing does have its benefits and drawbacks. It can provide participants with important nonverbal cues and encourage them to stay engaged. However, some people might feel uncomfortable and self-conscious using it which may lead to less participation than a voice-only meeting.

Do some homework on your options to see which technology will work best for your needs.

2. Tech Skills

A virtual meeting needs the guidance of an IT

person who has tech knowledge. This person has to be comfortable with the virtual meeting software and be able to operate the platform during the meeting. A rehearsal or test run before the actual meeting is advised. Detailed instructions for the participants is a must.

3. Spend Time Preparing

Virtual meetings need more time to prepare. Streamline your agenda, plan for dealing with conflicting discussion, prepare for technical challenges that may occur. Consider your timeframe, decide what you want to cover and give information in scheduled time segments. Make it clear when you reach that limit and move on to the next item.

If you can assign someone to handle the technology issues, delegate this task so you can focus on the meeting. Rehearse or test the meeting beforehand with the person assigned to handle the technology.

Several days before your meeting, send out login details and instructions to those attending. Include any passwords, an agenda, list of attendees, start time and finish time, if possible.

4. Set Rules

Ground rules are important because they guide the behavior of everyone attending. Ask the members to log in 5 minutes early so that everyone can check their audio and video connections. If this is an audio call only, have the participants state their name before they speak. Also, have them mute their lines until they are ready to speak to cut down on background noise.

5. Communicate with Virtual Reality in Mind

In face-to-face meetings, people pick up on important cues from facial expressions, tone of voice and body language. These are often lost in virtual/audio meetings. For these meetings, you must strengthen your listening skills and focus on the person who is speaking. Make sure you communicate how you feel through your choice of words. Summarize what has been said and ask questions for clarification. Guide discussion by calling on certain individuals.

6. Get Everyone Involved

One of the biggest challenges with virtual/audio meetings is the participants can find it hard to get involved and contribute. You, as the Leader, must keep everyone engaged. Give attendees the opportunity to participate and give their input. Use Round Robin techniques and ask everyone to comment

As you can see this is a complicated process, but it may be worth the time and effort to get the team together to communicate and achieve beneficial results in matters that need attention. It is not perfect but it may be one way that we stay connected to each other and continue to serve those in need of us. Keep safe, be well. God Bless.




A LITTLE LEVITY:






Supreme Council Columbiettes 2020 Convention

Let's Learn Together Did you know..

The difference between a Territorial Deputy and a District Deputy is her level of reporting.

Territorial Deputies are appointed by the Supreme President, with the approval of the Board of Directors, in jurisdictions where there is no State Council. Territorial Deputies have all the duties and obligations of a State President and serve in this position until a successor is appointed. She is a special representative of the Supreme President.

District Deputies are appointed by the State President and hold office at the pleasure and direction of the State President. Term of office is no longer than the State President's elected term. She is a special representative of the State President.

Both the Territorial Deputies and District Deputies supervise auxiliaries appointed to them and are responsible for the enforcement of the laws and rules of the Order. They also supervise the ceremonies of First Degree and Installation of Officers to ensure rehearsals and exemplifications are properly executed.

Other duties of both include reporting any deposition or suspensions made by her to the Supreme Secretary, file a written report of the condition of the auxiliary when requested to do so, and, in the case of a dissolution of an auxiliary, work with the officers to ensure all necessary paperwork is properly completed and Administration manuals are returned.


